

## **Legislation**

CASC has continually endeavored to channel student voice into impactful legislative change. Here are some of our landmark bills:

**AB-748 ( Carillo, 2022) -** Requires schools serving grades 6-12 to display mental health posters on campus, informing students of mental health tips and available resources

**AB-1867 (Lee, 2022) -** Requires schools to include plans for updating old plumbing infrastructure to CalGreen sustainability standards when planning modernization programs in the same indoor area

**AB-367 (Garcia, 2021)** - Requires all schools to provide free menstrual products to students in grades 6-12 in all-female restrooms, one men's restroom, and every all-gender restroom by the 2022-2023 school year

**AB-46 (L. Rivas, 2021) -** Creates California's first Youth Empowerment Commission — a commission made up of youth throughout California that advises the Governor

**AB-543 (Smith, 2019)** - Requires schools to display sexual harassment policy/resources on posters in public spaces

**AB-261 (Thurmond, 2017)** - Grants student members serving on their district board preferential voting rights

**SB-532 (Leyva, 2015)** - Mandates district boards to appoint a student board member when petitioned for by the student body

**AB-1204 (Chau, 2015)** - Encourages the State Board of Education to appoint a student member to the Instructional Quality Commission

**SB-1422 (Romero, 2010)** - Permits student governments to draft a survey by which students provide feedback to teachers

CASC bills are student-written and born through annual Student Advisory Board on Education/Student Advisory Board on Education in Legislation conferences, where delegates from all regions of California convene and brainstorm solutions to issues that impact students. We are proud to play a role in uplifting student voice and civic engagement for a better future.
